Dear Senators Klobuchar and Franken

We founded The Hunting and Angling Club back in the 1980's to alert the millions of Minnesota citizens that love the sports of hunting and fishing, about the looming destruction of their local economies, constitutional rights and quality of life, because of the ramifications of the American Indian Movement's historical revisionist 'treaty rights' and 'tribal sovereignty' unconstitutional destructive and immoral agenda's.

Now, almost thirty years later we have to say sadly, but very loudly and proudly, "We told you so!" Sadly, because so many of our friends, that tried to help us by upholding their oaths of office have suffered humiliating, vicious media attacks for trying to protect the greatest documents ever written to protect the rights of citizens in the history of mankind: The Declaration of Independence and The United States Constitution.

These documents are cast in stone and you have taken an oath of office to protect them. God is the only one that can change the Declaration of Independence that sets the standard on which every piece of legislation and every court ruling has to be made. Thomas Jefferson didn't use Gods name to get church into politics. He did it because no one can come up with a higher supreme 'Sovereign' power than God. So the only person that can change the principles that define our legislative and court rulings is God. The Declaration of Independence therefor mandates that every piece of legislation and every court ruling has to be for the health, welfare and happiness of 'We the People!'

After three decades of studying the AIM corporate and elite tax-exempt funded rhetoric for 'Justice' for our tribal brothers and sisters, and actively working with tribal citizens to help them restore their constitutional rights, we can truthfully say AIM has instead bred nothing but grave, evil injustices to the vast majority of all United States citizens. Especially our tribal citizens, who lost their rights when John D. Rockefeller orchestrated the Indian Reorganization Act., which led to the loss of their civil and human rights. The elite and their corporations have exploited our tribal citizens ever since to privatize the wealth of our nations valuable natural



resources for themselves, without paying for the land, while socializing all the resulting budget deficits onto the backs of the hard working majority.

Our once great Republic has been turned into more of an elite controlled corporate form of fascism with two economies. One constantly gains greater wealth and power for the elite through cheating and exploitation while the other oppresses the majority ever downward as more land is stolen and more laws violated.

We have been in both of your offices in Washington D.C. several times with tribal members while attending Citizen Equal Rights Alliance conferences. We have written personal notes to both of you about these problems to no avail.

A couple days ago we delivered a letter and packet of information to Governor Dayton requesting that he support our efforts to get a public informational legislative hearing at the high school in Onamia for the private landowner/intervened citizens who are still full parties to the ongoing Mille Lac Treaty Case management plan. We ask you to support this request. Their interests have never been heard. We are requesting that the meeting be held in late March so sports fishing tourism operators have time to prepare their plans and studies for testimony after the winter ice fishing season the end of February.

We further request that you organize a live panel debate on public television where you bring a couple public tribal agenda professionals to debate myself and a couple of my tribal friends about the disastrous failures of education for Indian children and other children of color here in Minnesota and across our entire nation.

And finally, as members of the Judiciary and Senate Select Committee on Indian Affairs, in the exercise of your committees constitutional duties to the citizens of Minnesota and these United States, we respectfully request that you both work together with State Constitutional leaders to produce and make public, to the citizens of Minnesota, the Proclamation, ratified by the voting public of the United States, that amends our U. S. Constitution to make the health, welfare, safety and benefits 'distinguishable' for a United States/Minnesota citizen with Indian ancestry/race.

We will be in contact with your local offices for responses to these requests.
